SOME FINAL THOUGHTS FROM YOUR PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters.

Holly and I lived just outside of Washington, D.C. back in 2014/2015. Our nation's capital city is an amazing place, filled with museums and monuments and history around every corner.

But what happens in this capital city is no less amazing—governance of the people, for the people, and by the people of the United States of America.

This week we witness one of the hallmarks of our democratic republic: the peaceful transfer of power from one presidency to another.

Objectively speaking, it is a rather remarkable thing! How many other nations/states in the history of the world can boast such a record: 44 (soon to be 45) contiguous peaceful transfers of power from one "ruler" to another.

Yet the inauguration of President-Elect Biden comes on the heels of violence and bloodshed during the assault on the Capitol on January 6, 2021. And it breaks my heart to see such extreme security measures being adopted.





With passions still running high from the Presidential Election and the contested results, let us pray for peace and civility, and that God preserve our nation from violence and discord. The President is due our honor and respect, as are all authorities that God places over us.

Remember: the Fourth Commandment isn't just about moms and dads—it includes all those in authority over us. As know, God tells us that we are to honor our fathers and our mothers—that we should fear and love God so that we do not despise or ager our parents and other authorities, but honor them, serve and obey them, love and cherish them.

In the Large Catechism, Doctor Luther goes on to explain that: "The same may be said of obedience to the civil authority, which, as we have said, belongs in the category of 'fatherhood' as a walk of life, and is the most comprehensive of all. For here one is the father not of an individual family, but of as many people as he has inhabitants, citizens, or subjects. Through civil rulers, as through our own parents, God gives us food, house and home, protection and security, and He preserves us through them. Therefore, because they bear this name and title with all honor as their chief distinction, it is also our duty to honor and respect them as the most precious treasure and most priceless jewel on earth" (LC I 150, Kolb-Wengert).

All this is to say that whether we like or dislike our parents, pastors, rulers, or other authorities, we are still to render honor and obedience, to love them, and to treasure them. We do this to the glory of our Father in heaven.
