SECOND READING Romans 9:1-13

P The Epistle is from Romans, chapter 9.

¹I am speaking the truth in Christ—I am not lying; my conscience bears me witness in the Holy Spirit— ²that I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. ³For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my brothers, my kinsmen according to the flesh. ⁴They are Israelites, and to them belong the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises. ⁵To them belong the patriarchs, and from their race, according to the flesh, is the Christ who is God over all, blessed forever. Amen.

⁶But it is not as though the word of God has failed. For not all who are descended from Israel belong to Israel, ⁷ and not all are children of Abraham because they are his offspring, but "Through Isaac shall your offspring be named." 8This means that it is not the children of the flesh who are the children of God, but the children of the promise are counted as offspring. 9For this is what the promise said: "About this time next year I will return and Sarah shall have a son." ¹⁰And not only so, but also when Rebecca had conceived children by one man, our forefather Isaac, 11though they were not yet born and had done nothing either good or bad—in order that God's purpose of election might continue, not because of works but because of His call— ¹²she was told, "The older will serve the younger." ¹³As it is written, "Jacob I loved, but Esau I hated."

¹⁷They said to Him, "We have only five loaves here and two fish."



SOME FINAL THOUGHTS FROM YOUR PASTOR

Brothers and sisters,

So we bought a Facebook Portal TV for my parents and got one for ourselves. I had toyed with the idea for several months, usually deciding that it was an extravagance because we are able to do Facetime on our Apple iPads. But the thought kept nagging at me.

What finally won me over was the thought that the image of my parents on our television would be much larger—almost life-size—and little Sam might recognize Grandma and Grandpa as people and not just moving shapes and colors on a small screen. And it seemed to work! Sam giggled and stared at Grandma and Grandpa (he really cranked-up the cute factor!) and interacted with them somewhat.

We had a good, long visit. It felt like we were hanging out together in one big virtual living room. Without having to hold onto something in my hands but just sitting back, drinking coffee or chasing after Leo, and talking was liberating. It felt more "normal" to be hands-free. And having the chance to be a family with my parents made me realize that this purchase was a good one—a necessary one.

As we turn the calendar page to the eighth month of this year (and the twentieth week of isolation), I confess that I am lonely. Holly has said the same. And, though he doesn't seem to have the words to express it, I think Leo is feeling it, and Sam, also. I would bet you're feeling it, too.

It's okay to feel lonely and it's okay to say it isn't good! Humanity was made for relationships: in relationship with God but also, *and almost just as important*, in relationship with each other. We are supposed to be interacting with others, be that work or school or church or a club or the grocery store.

We are supposed to be present—physically and spiritually—with others who bear the image and likeness of God. "It is not good that man should be alone," said God (Gen. 2:18). And if God says it isn't good . . . well, that's pretty bad! *But for now*, we endure this separation and work around it.

And one way that we can feel less alone is being able to see other people and talk with them—no masks, just faces. And that's exactly what we do with our **Study of the Psalms** on "Zoom" **every Tuesday at Noon (ending by 1:00pm)**. We socialize for the first 15 minutes and work through the psalm from 12:15pm to 12:45pm, concluding by 1:00pm. This week we study Psalm 15. **Please do join me.**
