



O Lord, my sal- vation!


Glory be to the Father and | to the Son*

P A reading from Romans, chapter five.




The congregation begins the response as the pastor concludes each petition, so that the word "Lord" is sung together.




- **P** For the peace from above and for our salvation, let us pray to the Lord:


