

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On this Holy Trinity Sunday, we do not explain God—we confess Him. We testify to Him who has revealed Himself to us. To the mind in search of reasonable answers, God will always be a question or riddle to be solved. But to the empty heart, the Holy Spirit leads us to see with faith the God whose majesty has worked for our salvation and whose mercy has rescued us sinners from sin and the grave.

Like Nicodemus, we want to know how, yet our Lord gives us not the how, but the Who—not the explanation, but the mystery of mercy big enough to save us. We come today confessing with our forefathers in faith and with all the saints of heaven the Athanasian Creed. singing "Holy, Holy," to the One in Three, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, one God, three Persons, now and forever.

<sup>14</sup>Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, . . .

<sup>22</sup>"Men of Israel, hear these words: Jesus of Nazareth, a Man attested to you by God with mighty works and wonders and signs that God did through Him in your midst, as you yourselves know— <sup>23</sup>this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. <sup>24</sup>God raised Him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for Him to be held by it.

<sup>29</sup>"Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. <sup>30</sup>Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him that He would set one of his descendants on his throne, <sup>31</sup>he foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, that He was not abandoned to Hades, nor did His flesh see corruption. <sup>32</sup>This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. <sup>33</sup>Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, He has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing.

<sup>34</sup>"For David did not ascend into the heavens, but he himself says,

'The LORD said to my Lord,

Sit at My right hand,



HOLY GOSPEL John 3:1–17

P The Holy Gospel according to Saint John, the third chapter.



<sup>1</sup>Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. <sup>2</sup>This man came to Jesus by night and said to Him, "Rabbi, we know that You are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with him."

<sup>3</sup>Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God."

<sup>4</sup>Nicodemus said to Him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?"

<sup>5</sup>Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. <sup>6</sup>That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. <sup>7</sup>Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' <sup>8</sup>The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit."

<sup>9</sup>Nicodemus said to Him, "How can these things be?"

<sup>10</sup>Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things? <sup>11</sup>Truly, truly, I say to you, We speak of what We know, and bear witness to what We have seen, but you do not receive Our testimony. <sup>12</sup>If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things? <sup>13</sup>No one has ascended into heaven except He who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. <sup>14</sup>And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, <sup>15</sup>that whoever believes in Him may have eternal life. <sup>16</sup>For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. <sup>17</sup>For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through Him."

#### ATHANASIAN CREED


- Whoever desires to be saved must, above all, hold the catholic faith.
- Whoever does not keep it whole and undefiled will without doubt perish eternally.
- <sup>3</sup> And the catholic faith is this,
- 4 that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in Unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance.
- <sup>5</sup> For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is another.
- <sup>6</sup> But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal.
- Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit:
- 8 the Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated;
- 9 the Father infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite;
- <sup>10</sup> the Father eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal.
- <sup>11</sup> And yet there are not three Eternals, but one Eternal.
- <sup>12</sup> just as there are not three Uncreated or three Infinites, but one Uncreated and one Infinite.
- <sup>13</sup> In the same way, the Father is almighty, the Son almighty, the Holy Spirit almighty;
- <sup>14</sup> and yet there are not three Almighties, but one Almighty.
- <sup>15</sup> So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God;
- <sup>16</sup> and yet there are not three Gods, but one God.
- <sup>17</sup> So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord;
- <sup>18</sup> and yet there are not three Lords, but one Lord.
- <sup>19</sup> Just as we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord, so also are we prohibited by the catholic religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.
- <sup>20</sup> The Father is not made nor created nor begotten by anyone.
- <sup>21</sup> The Son is neither made nor created, but begotten of the Father alone.
- <sup>22</sup> The Holy Spirit is of the Father and of the Son, neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeding.

- <sup>23</sup> Thus, there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.
- <sup>24</sup> And in this Trinity none is before or after another; none is greater or less than another;
- <sup>25</sup> but the whole three persons are coeternal with each other and coequal, so that in all things, as has been stated above, the Trinity in Unity and Unity in Trinity is to be worshiped.
- <sup>26</sup> Therefore, whoever desires to be saved must think thus about the Trinity.
- <sup>27</sup> But it is also necessary for everlasting salvation that one faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- <sup>28</sup> Therefore, it is the right faith that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at the same time both God and man.
- <sup>29</sup> He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages; and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age:
- <sup>30</sup> perfect God and perfect man, composed of a rational soul and human flesh;
- <sup>31</sup> equal to the Father with respect to His divinity, less than the Father with respect to His humanity.
- <sup>32</sup> Although He is God and man, He is not two, but one Christ:
- <sup>33</sup> one, however, not by the conversion of the divinity into flesh, but by the assumption of the humanity into God;
- <sup>34</sup> one altogether, not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person.
- <sup>35</sup> For as the rational soul and flesh is one man, so God and man is one Christ,
- <sup>36</sup> who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again the third day from the dead,
- <sup>37</sup> ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, God Almighty, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.
- <sup>38</sup> At His coming all people will rise again with their bodies and give an account concerning their own deeds.
- <sup>39</sup> And those who have done good will enter into eternal life, and those who have done evil into eternal fire.
- <sup>40</sup> This is the catholic faith; whoever does not believe it faithfully and firmly cannot be saved.



## SOME FINAL THOUGHTS FROM YOUR PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters,

On Holy Trinity Sunday we recite the most lengthy and most precise of the three ecumenical creeds: the Athanasian Creed. While it is repetitive, long, intricate, and can be at times confusing, it is *thorough* in detailing who and what the Holy Trinity is and what He is not. It *can also* be a source of a bit of fun—there is a great little video by *Lutheran Satire* that shows how the Creeds help guard us from misunderstandings and false-teachings. Also, I'm writing my "final thoughts" on Friday, a bit earlier this week than usual (most of the time I write these final thoughts late on a Saturday night), because I'm off to receive my COVID-19 vaccination and word on the street is that I'm not going to feel very well on Saturday.

I admit I'm a bit anxious. There are a lot of competing "voices" in mass media and online, all with different takes on the vaccines as regards safety, effectiveness, ethical development, and so on.

To be fair, a lot of these concerns have merit—and there is merit to the reasons for one to get the vaccine—but I draw the line at the conspiracy theories about being "microchipped" by the government (I just can't give credence to that one LOL!).

But there was a paragraph in the Fact Sheet that stood out to me and gave me pause for concern: "The Janssen COVID-19 Vaccine is *an unapproved vaccine* that may prevent COVID-19. . . . The FDA has authorized the *emergency use* of the Janssen COVID-19 Vaccine . . ." (*emphasis* added).

Now, this isn't stopping me from getting the vaccine today, but I won't fault anyone for thinking twice and waiting to get one of these or another vaccine in the future.
