Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is often called "Good Shepherd Sunday."

Today, we reflect on how the Holy Spirit continues to direct the Church to "hear the voice of our Shepherd" (*Collect*) as we live in this "valley of the shadow of death" (*Introit*).

In Jesus, our Good Shepherd, we know what true love actually is, for He lays down His life for us (*Epistle*), His sheep (*Gospel*). Moreover, as our Good Shepherd leads us to our eternal home, we love one another as He first loved us (1 John 3:23; 4:19).

Through the love of the Church and the Word that she confesses, the Spirit calls others in this lost world to hear the Good Shepherd's voice (John 10:16).

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.





- **C** Lord, have mercy.
- Lord God, out of Your fatherly goodness You have remembered us poor, miserable sinners and given Your beloved Son to be our Shepherd not only to nourish us by His Word, but also to defend us from sin, death, and the devil. Grant us Your Holy Spirit, that even as this Shepherd knows us and helps in every affliction, we also may know Him, trust Him, seek help and comfort in Him, heartily obey His voice, and obtain eternal salvation; through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.


CONCLUDING COLLECT

SOME FINAL THOUGHTS FROM YOUR PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters,

Alleluia! Christ is Risen! . . . He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

I don't think Holly has shared with most of you that she was involved in a rather serious car accident during her freshman year of high school, resulting in an unexpected helicopter ride on a "Flight for Life." Long story short, she was ejected from the back seat of the car (which, by the way, was NOT equipped with seatbelts—Holly is always safety conscious so this one isn't her fault). She landed on a pile of concrete rubble down in a ditch by the road and was pretty mangled—she even had to have her left hip screwed back together (and then had to have the screws removed once things were finally holding together).

She spent several months in a wheelchair (and still cheered on the cheerleading squad . . . which apparently can be done from a wheelchair!). Eventually, she ditched the wheels and moved to crutches. Finally, the day came when she could walk on her own! Holly wasn't reckless (it just isn't her nature) but you know what?! Amidst all of her numerous injuries, the doctors had missed a break in her ankle. Holly ended up having to go back on crutches.

I'm sharing with you this story (with Holly's permission) because I think it is a fitting reminder that no matter how "ready" and anxious we are to get "back to normal" there may yet be unforeseen complications.

It has been about three weeks since Imperial County moved from the Purple to Orange Tier of California's Blueprint for a Safer Economy (that is the name of the reopening plan . . . I looked it up). Quite a few more things are "opening up" and our daily lives are moving closer to "normal."

That being said, the Orange Tier isn't the "most open" (there is still the Yellow Tier . . . and I can't help but wonder why the chart I looked at didn't have a "tier" for Back-to-Normal but I trust we'll get there eventually).

This week, we resume communion at the altar rail. Not everyone is totally comfortable with this (and that is okay—I understand the hesitancy and invite any who are uncomfortable to stand at the rail instead of kneeling so that you needn't touch anything except the body and blood of Jesus).

I understand the desire to get "back to normal" and we ARE moving in that direction . . . slowly . . . but now is still a time for prudence and patience.

This is part of Saint Paul's admonition to "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ" (Gal 6:2).

On a lighter note, this week is Leo's Fifth Birthday! As you can see in the picture, he is VERY EXCITED!

I'm going to be on vacation with the birthday boy and Holly and Sam this week so we will NOT be having our weekly "Zoom" Bible Study on Tuesday. However, we WILL have our Wednesday Prayer Service at 7:00pm; the only catch is that it is going to be pre-recorded and will be "premiering" (you know, like Hollywood movies) on Facebook at 7:00pm on Wednesday. Our Bible Study and in-person Wednesday service will resume next week.
