Two reflected the goodness and faithfulness of their master and enter into his joy. One refused to act like his master and was punished for his insolence.

Consider Jesus, our good and faithful Master, and all that He has done for us and our salvation. It is not our own work that leads us into the joy of our Master; rather, it is His work on our behalf—Jesus’ saving work of life, death, and resurrection—that brings us into the joy of the Father.

As we follow Him, we reflect the goodness and faithfulness that is the very nature of our God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. “For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God has prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them” (Ephesians 2:10).



SOME FINAL THOUGHTS FROM YOUR PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters,

Heinz Tomato Ketchup famously declares “Good things come to those who wait.” While that may be true for ketchup (yes, I do LOVE ketchup), I can’t say that it is a universal truth. And I KNOW that Leo and every other kid on the planet will tell you that “waiting is THE WORST!”

And waiting for the results of the national election is feeding fear and creating uncertainty. No matter the result, some will be joyful while others will be disheartened; but waiting is a challenge. In the face of uncertainty, it’s good for us to recall God’s command and promise.

First, we are to honor those in positions of authority.

“Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God” (Romans 13:1-2).

We are subject first to the rule of law (the Constitution of the United States of America, the California State Constitution, etcetera) and second to those who hold offices according to mandate. We are to honor and respect our elected officials. We are free to disagree with them and work for change but we are not to hate or despise them (check the Fourth Commandment). Instead, we pray for them.

Second, we must remember that all earthly rule and authority is temporary.

“Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation. When his breath departs, he returns to the earth; on that very day his plans perish” (Psalm 146:3-4).

The Lord is king—forever and ever—and His kingdom is not like the political rule of this or any other nation on earth. He says, “My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were part of this world, My servants would have been fighting” (John 18:36).

So no matter what—don’t put your trust in rulers . . . they are but mortal. Trust in the Lord!

You stand a redeemed child of the one true God and He has prepared good works in which you should walk, namely: **love your family; laugh and enjoy the good gifts of creation; read and study and love His Word; and pray, praise, and give thanks to Him always.**

Speaking of family and laughter, I really want to share with you a great picture of Sam! He’s my **little guy with a great big smile** and even bigger (and louder) laugh! I hope it brings you a smile, too!
